SUPERBOWL CLEANUP ALSO INVOLVES A GAME PLAN *As city and stadium prepare for a record number of fans, someone has to take out the trash*

DALLAS –February 7, 2011—Attendees at this year’s Super Bowl at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Tex. February 6 will cheer on the Pittsburgh Steelers and the Green Bay Packers at one of the year’s biggest days in sports and they will leave behind a lot of trash. Another key team will help make the management of those materials a seamless part of the day’s events.
